



The Wiikwemkoong Child and Family Services department is seeking a qualified individual to fill the Supervisor position for the Children and Youth Wellness Leaders. Wiikwemkoong Unceded Territory (WUT) Child and Family Services oversees and advocates for child and family matters by following the principals and ethics of Wiikwemkoong's Gchi Naaknigewin, Wiikwemkoong's Children's Bill of Rights and Wiikwemkoong Community Standards. This will ensure the services are culturally appropriate to support the community's children and families in alignment with Anishnaabe values and practices. The Children and Youth Wellness Leaders Supervisor will report directly to the Director of Child and Family Services.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- In collaboration with Children and Youth Wellness Leaders, develop and implement wellness programs that address physical, social, mental and emotional health concerns.
- Lead and supervise a team of Children and Youth Wellness Leaders, providing guidance, support and direction.
- Maintain up to date knowledge of best practices in child and youth wellness and preventive care.
- In collaboration with the Children and Youth Wellness Leaders, maintain accurate records and documentation of program activities and outcomes.
- Monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of wellness program, collecting data from programs being completed and obtaining feedback to continually improve and adapt initiatives to better serve the community.
- Advocate for the needs and rights of children and youth within the community ensuring their voices are heard and their well-being is prioritized.
- Provide monthly/quarterly reports to Director of Child and Family Services based on service delivery workplans.
- Participate in professional development with current best practices in prevention and wellness promotion.

REQUIREMENTS

- Bachelor of Social Work Degree or a related degree in social services field is preferred.
- Minimum of two (2) years of supervisory experience in working with children and youth in a wellness, education or prevention capacity within a First Nation Community.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills, with the ability to advocate for the children and youth needs.
- Excellent conflict resolution and problem-solving skills.
- Ability to manage multiple priorities and work in a fast paced environment
- Ability to understand and speak Anishnaabemowin is a definite asset.
